



DCLAYF Committee Role and Responsibilities

Each show or event held during DCLAYF will have a committee responsible for making continual improvements to their assigned shows to ensure its current relevance, quality, and is up to industry standards.

Committee membership is offered to and should consist of:

- One Agricultural Science Teacher (AST) per school and one parent representative per school.
- A Denton County AgriLife Extension Agent and one parent representative from Denton County 4-H.
 - The AST or agent must submit committee nominations to the show secretary by **June 30, 2021**, through the online form on the website.
 - Superintendent and Assistant are non-voting members.

Committee Member Responsibilities

- Attend committee meetings and volunteer to work at the fair during setup, show, auction, and animal load out.
- Nominate and elect a slate of judges.
 - Animal Committees
 - Each chapter is asked to bring a judge nomination to the committee during the appropriate meeting. Nominations will be voted on and placed in a slate and order. The committee is asked to have at least five judges ranked in a slate. The general show super superintendent will then secure the judge based off the slate with a contract.
 - **Committees should consider the following when selecting judges:**
 - Are they local to Denton County? Judges should not be selected that are local to the county.
 - Do they actively sell or market that species to local youth?
 - Are they qualified to judge both breeding, market, and showmanship of that species?
 - Non-Animal Committees
 - Each chapter is asked to bring a judge nomination to the committee during the appropriate meeting. Nominations will be voted on and placed in a slate and order.
 - **Committees should consider the following when selecting judges:**
 - Are they local to Denton County exhibitors? We should not select individuals that have ties to a club, chapter, or exhibitor.
 - Are they qualified to judge the event?
